Tá POBAL, grúpa abhcóideachta na Gaeilge, ag eagrú Cearta & Ceiliúradh arís i mbliana.

POBAL, the Irish language advocacy group, are organising its Rights and Revelry event again this year.

Rights & revelry is now in its fourth year. This time, it will take the shape of a 2 day festival, with the main event taking place on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> October in the Ulster Hall, to be preceded by an Umbrella Parade on behalf of the Irish Language Act.

This is a great opportunity to showcase the excellent work of the Irish language groups and the GAA, in front of a huge crowd (last year's event attracted an audience of 1,500 people) and to send a strong message to the British government that they must fulfil the promise they made in the St. Andrew's Agreement to enact an Irish Language Act in the North.

One of the main challenges we face each year is having enough stewards to ensure that everyone has the best possible day. The GAA have a particular opportunity this year to show their important role as community leaders whilst wearing their team colours/shirts.

Last year, we were helped and supported by members of St. Malachy's GAC and St. Enda's GAC, for which we were very grateful, but again this year, we are depending on volunteers to come and help us.

Is there any way that the Ulster Council CLG could help us this year? We are looking for stewards, men and women over the age of 18, to help look after the different events, e.g;

- The venue at Belfast City Hall
- Walking with the parade
- Outside and inside the Ulster Hall (including cleaning the venue afterwards)
- The street between Belfast City hall and the Ulster Hall

Unfortunately, we cannot pay expenses, however we will provide meals for all workers.

We would be delighted if the stewards could wear their respective team shirts (although everyone will also have to wear a 'Hi-Viz' jacket as well)

I hope we can work together on this.
